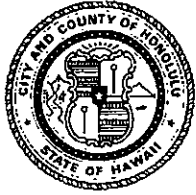

6th Annual Community Clean-up—A Recycling Extravaganza

(HONOLULU, HI) – The public is invited to bring their recyclables to **Kaimuki High School on Saturday, October 17, 2009 between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. for the 6th Annual Community Clean-Up.** Funds raised for this event will benefit Kaimuki High School, Kapahulu Community Center and the Moiliili Community Center.

Residents of the Kapahulu, Kaimuki, Palolo, St. Louis Heights, Manoa, Makiki, Ala Moana and McCully-Moiliili neighborhoods are encouraged to bring their recyclables to the parking lot of **Kaimuki High School on Saturday between 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.** For those residents of the area who are unable to bring in their recyclables, pick-up will be available during the event. To schedule a pick-up, please call 285-6481 or 306-1876 or your elected official.

This would be a great time to clean out clutter and your neighborhoods while at the same time support the community, promote recycling, and divert trash from our landfills.

Elected officials spearheading the project include: Congressman Neil Abercrombie, Councilmember Ann Kobayashi, Senator Brian Taniguchi, House Speaker Calvin Say, and Representatives Isaac Choy, Scott Nishimoto, and Scott Saiki.

New recyclers have joined the program including Walmart, who will be collecting plastic bags and plastic hangers; and Family Towing, offering free towing service for unwanted cars; and for preventing identity theft, bring your confidential documents for free shredding by Access Information Management.

Recyclables include:

- Scrap metal: auto parts, bicycles, all metal appliances, lawn mowers, pipes, beams
- Newspaper, cardboard, telephone books, magazines
- Beverage containers – HI-5
- Plastic bags, plastic hangers
- Old tires (passenger only, 4 tires only per car/household)
- Athletic shoes (no metal cleats)
- Green waste

- Batteries
- Cellular phones
- Printer cartridges
- Computers & accessories (Must be delivered)
- Shredding of confidential documents
- Electronics, E-Waste
- Cooking oil
- Used eyeglasses, hearing aids
- Re-usable household items, clothing, etc. for Goodwill Industries
